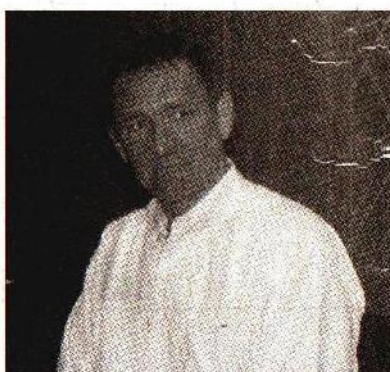
Emergency birth control pills... Better life options and perfect health!!

CHRISTOPHER H. Purdy president and CEO of DKT Global said: "The foundation specialised in social education for bettering reproductive health, and that the prevailing trend now in the world is calling for the need for family planning", he gave examples using the demographic survey of Egypt in 2014 confirming that there are 400,000 unplanned children born annually, his statements came during a meeting in Cairo with some representatives of the Egyptian media and press as part of the celebration of DKT global of 10 years of its presence in Egypt.

Purdy said DKT helped many of the women and healthcare providers in clarifying emergency contraceptives and their effectiveness, detailing conditions and restrictions of use where no more than two doses per month can be used, emergency contraception was explained as useful in many situations as in the case of unplanned intercourse or in cases of condom failure or missing a dose of original contraceptive method.

DKT CEO explained that the foundation produces doses of emergency birth control pills locally in Techno Pharma's Alexandria factory, where about 200 000 doses are manufactured annually.

Purdy said , that only 7 per cent of women who already use contraception know that there is a chance of preventing pregnancy after intercourse while the



remaining 93 per cent of women users of family planning methods are not taught about the existence of this possibility, this contributes to the high incidence of pregnancy-flop "unplanned".

DKT promotes the concept of using the family way in informing people about pills for emergency contraception," which have been available for more than 20

years globally and were introduced in Egypt by DKT since 2007.

Purdy identified that the issues of unplanned pregnancy do not fall only on women, but must be shared by the man to avoid unplanned pregnancies. He talked about the use of "condoms" asking to listen to the views of Egyptian men about them; he emphasised that DKT works in many Muslim cultures like Pakistan and Malaysia with great acceptance from Muslim men and women. Purdy explained the benefits of this method which protects men and Women against some diseases even among married couples in addition to the sensitivity of some women towards some contraceptive means therefore that man bears part of the responsibility in this regard.

DKT's CEO said the foundation produces approximately 400,000 medicated IUDs annually and that these are used in the Egyptian market being one of the safe ways suiting some women who prefer long term contraception. DKT's CEO add " I think we want to grow, we want to bring in new products and services, and also more education. To do those things it takes resources, it takes money, so we need to find money, either from DKT Washington, or here in Egypt. The more we grow the more money we need and the more we can help couples in Egypt.
