Penalties for violating universal healthcare law

Penalties for violating the universal healthcare law include a six-month prison term and a fine of up to EGP 10,000 for those who provide inaccurate data or abstain from providing the required data. Those who prevent universal healthcare system employees from doing their jobs - such as inspecting facilities or reviewing records - will be jailed for six months and will pay a fine of up to EGP 100,000. Other violations include offering services to ineligible individuals or preventing someone from accessing the system's services.
